

## **REQUIREMENTS FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION**

The deadline for abstract submission is 15 June 2026.

The document must be prepared in Microsoft Word format, Times New Roman font, font size 12, single-spaced (1.0), with justified alignment.

The volume should be from 1 to 3 typed pages (up to 7,000 characters, including spaces and references).

The abstract must contain the following publication details:

In the first line, the title is printed in uppercase letters, bold, centered.

After a single line space, italicized, aligned to the left, the author's initials and surname are indicated.

On the next line, italicized, aligned to the right, the following information is provided: country (for international participants), city, name of the educational institution, educational program, year of study, email address.

The list of references is formatted after a blank line following the text (no more than 5 main sources) in accordance with GOST 7.1–2003.

The abstract must clearly state the problem under consideration, the approach used to solve it, and present the main results obtained.

Submissions with abstracts that do not reflect the main provisions of the presentation, as well as those shorter than one page, will not be considered.

Abstracts must be written competently, without spelling, punctuation, or stylistic errors. The author bears full responsibility for the scientific content and presentation of the material.

The conference proceedings will be published on the website on 9 September 2026.

Abstracts that do not meet the stated requirements or are submitted after the deadline will not be reviewed or published.

## **REQUIREMENTS FOR ARTICLE SUBMISSION**

The deadline for article submission is 15 June 2026.

The length of the manuscript of an original article must be 2,000–3,000 words, excluding the abstract, reference list, tables, and figures.

Font: Times New Roman; font size 12; single-spaced (1.0); justified alignment without hyphenation; paragraph indent — 1.25 cm.

Margins: left — 2.5 cm, right — 2.5 cm, top — 2.5 cm, bottom — 2.5 cm.

All abbreviations and acronyms must be spelled out at their first occurrence in the text.

Tables and figures (illustrations, graphs, photographs), as well as their captions, must be submitted in the same file as the main text and placed within the article pages after their first mention.

The total number of tables and figures in original articles should generally not exceed 5.

The approximate placement of illustrative material should be indicated in the right margin of the text.

The conference proceedings will be published on the website on 9 September 2026.

## **REQUIREMENTS FOR PRESENTATIONS (+ ABSTRACT FORMATTING)**

The deadline for submitting applications to participate as a presenter is 15 June 2026.

The conference program will be published on the website on 20 July 2026.

One author may present one individual paper and no more than two co-authored papers at the conference.

Presentation proposals are subject to review and selection by section moderators.

Submission of a presentation proposal does not guarantee its final inclusion in the conference program.

Presentations must be prepared in PowerPoint format and designed for 5–7 minutes, with 3–5 minutes allocated for questions and discussion.

(Presentations must be submitted by the authors to the Organizing Committee no later than 10 August 2026.)

An application for a presentation must be accompanied by the abstracts of the proposed presentation.

### **General Requirements for Abstract Formatting**

The document must be prepared in Word format using Times New Roman, font size 12, 1.5 line spacing, with justified alignment.

The length must be 1 to 3 typed pages (up to 7,000 characters, including spaces and references).

Abstracts must contain the following information:

The title is placed on the first line, written in uppercase letters, bold, and center-aligned.

After one line space, the author's initials and surname are indicated in italics, right-aligned.

On the next line, in italics and right-aligned, indicate the country (for foreign participants), city, name of the educational institution, academic program, year of study, and email address.

The reference list is placed one line below the text (no more than 5 key sources) and formatted in accordance with GOST 7.1–2003.

The abstracts must clearly formulate the research problem, describe the approach used to address it, and present the main results obtained.

Submissions with abstracts that do not reflect the main content of the presentation, as well as those shorter than one page, will not be considered.

Abstracts must be written accurately and free of spelling, punctuation, and stylistic errors.

The author bears full responsibility for the scientific content and presentation of the material.

Abstracts that do not comply with the stated requirements or are submitted after the deadline will not be reviewed or published.
